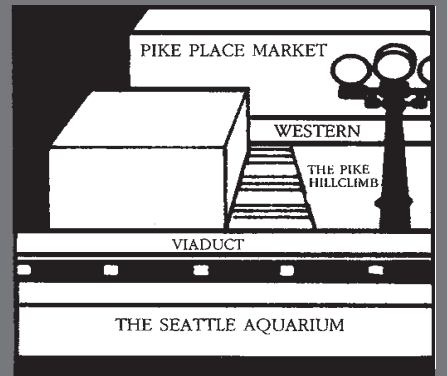
Besides our crescendo collection of local celebrities, some globally recognized favorites passed through:
