A Market friend in need

Late Saturday night, July 17, Mick King – former Corner Produce/Simply The Best/Deja Vu employee – was severely attacked. He and a friend were crossing Broadway at Denny Way and were nearly struck by a silver-gray car.

Words were exchanged. The driver got out of his car and the altercation ended with the driver severely beating King's head into the sidewalk.

When King arrived at the hospital doctors weren't sure if he would make it through the night. He was in a coma for two days, and is now in surgical ICU, with

an uncertain future. He needs help from his community.

His assailant, an African-American male, 5'7"-5'8", late 20s - early 30s, is still at large. There was a woman in the driver's seat. Please contact the Seattle Police Department with any helpful information.
